The brochure also shows the benefits of soil stabilisation with cement or hydraulic binders as an environmentally-friendly and cost effective method of converting poor quality soil into structural layers with high bearing capacity.

EUPAVE participates in European Road Infrastructure Congress 18-20 October

EUPAVE and its members were well represented at the 1st European Road Infrastructure Congress on 18-20 October in Leeds, UK, organised by ERF.

EUPAVE was represented by Karl Downey and Luc Rens, as well as by members BBS Barriers and Deltabloc.

The congress offered the chance to discuss the challenges and opportunities for the road sector across Europe over the coming years, especially on the themes of safety, sustainability and innovation.

EUPAVE Secretary General, Karl Downey, gave a presentation on sustainable roads and public procurement, in which he highlighted the potential for the new EU Public Procurement Directives to boost competition in road construction and save public authorities money, while promoting sustainability.

EUPAVE now also organises regular public workshops on best practices, to which Partners have free access. A workshop on "Achieving and maintaining the evenness of concrete pavements" was held in May 2015, followed by a workshop on "Joints in concrete pavements" in February 2016. In early 2017, two further technical workshops are planned (details to be announced soon).

Furthermore, **being a Partner of EUPAVE** offers you the chance to participate for free in site visits, reduced fees for the International Symposium on Concrete Roads, organised by EUPAVE every 4 years, and gives you access to EUPAVE publications.

This broadening in membership means that EUPAVE is increasingly a place where players all along the value chain of concrete pavements can meet and network - as well as strengthening our basis to continue promoting cement and concrete solutions for transport infrastructure in Europe.

T Zen bus network

Conceived and designed by STIF (French syndicat of transport from Paris department), T Zen is the future Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) network of the French department of Île-de-France. A new means of transport maximised every step of the way: dedicated traffic lane, easily identifiable stations, facilitated connections with other networks, etc.

Using concrete was a natural choice, according to Olivier Goyat, Construction Manager of Signature, who developed T Zen 1. Besides the fact there is no rutting with concrete, its strength and flexibility were also the main advantages, as well as the maximised skid resistance and the little maintenance needed.
